Adult Education: Glenn Adult Program

This alternative education program is designed to allow students to make up partial credits in order to meet the Orland High School graduation requirements.

Before a student can begin in the program he/she must meet with their OHS counselor and determine which credits are needed and get a concurrent enrollment form and contract. A parent must sign the enrollment form if the student is younger than 18 years of age. The program is designed for seniors first and then juniors on a space available basis.

Once a student begins the class, attendance is monitored and is required until the credits are completed. If a student misses 2 consecutive classes, he/she may be dropped and may not be allowed re-enroll.

Credits are earned through the Glenn Adult Program's independent study program. A student will receive 1 credit of work each week to take home. Additional work will not be assigned until the work is returned, corrected and you have taken the test. Credit will be received only when both the homework and the test are completed with a score of 70% or higher.
