

Apprenticeships



Immediate start to a union career in the trades industry right out of high school.

An apprenticeship is a system of learning while earning, and "learning by doing." It combines training on the job with related and supplemental instruction at school.

Apprentices attend classes of related technical instruction, usually in the public schools, to supplement the on-the-job training that is done under the supervision of skilled workers.

The period of training is from 1 to 6 years, depending upon the trade. Most programs are for 4 years.
