- ✓ Most scholarships require a writing sample either in the form of an autobiographical statement or an essay on a specific topic.
- ✓ Deadlines are crucial. Scholarship committees cannot consider your application if it is LATE.
- $\checkmark$  Neatness is a must. Always type the essay part of your application.
- ✓ Remember: If you don't apply, you have already eliminated yourself!
